Artist Statement

I volunteer at the Burke Museum where I catalogue mostly aged and sometimes contemporary baskets. Rarely, do I see a basket that is asymmetrical, unless it has had a hard life. It would have been unthinkable for a weaver to make an asymmetrical basket.

Unlike those weavers, I do not strive for symmetry in my baskets.

I live not far from the Dale Chihuly Boathouse Studio. His glass baskets were inspired by his family's collection of Northwest Native American baskets. Some were misshaped, slumped and asymmetrical due to age or use. His beautiful glass baskets reflect those shapes.

My baskets are also irregular in shape. They are squashed, puckered and my intention is they not be symmetrical.

Basketry is done with repetitive hand movements and can be meditative. Tying knots is taking that process even further. I tie waxed linen knots over wooden brush handles. Like baskets, brushes are familiar, overlooked and utilitarian. I am fascinated by the shapes of the handles and the bristles that emerge from them, and how the knots transform them.

I'm not sure why I started knotting over pieces of garden hose. Probably because they were there. I like how they change as they become covered with knots. I like connecting 2 pieces together. I also like how people respond to them.

I have studied with fiber artists including Dorothy Gill Barnes, John Garrett, Ann Coddington, Jiro Yonezawa, Norman Sherfield, Jackie Abrams and Layne Goldsmith.

I completed the University of Washington Extension Certificate Program in Fiber Arts in 2008.
