Don Moore's life story reflects a duality that is not lost on him. He was born in Atlanta, Georgia, but grew up along the coast of Southern California where his love for drawing and painting started at a young age. Although his interest in graphic design led him to spend 30 years in the advertising and design industry as an art director and creative director, his interest in fine art never faded and he continued to paint throughout this period of time. In 2011, Don went back to school and earned his BFA in Drawing and Painting from the Academy of Art in San Francisco, followed by a Master's degree from the same institution.

Don's latest body of work, which uses sacred geometry to create strong compositional grids in combination with his more expressionistic painterly style, captures the current moment in each person's journey. He intentionally uses non-traditional poses to present a playfulness in the staging, resulting in intimate portrait paintings that depict the inner resolve found in the eyes and body language of his subjects.

This project reflects Don's interest in studying the psychology of today's portrait and our need to fit in or be "liked." He has used his interest in math and organizing content to create compositions that are fragmented and abstracted through the use of sacred geometry. This approach allows for multiple views from different angles, creating a visual purpose that is actually part of the physical fabric of our universe.

Don remains deeply committed to his craft and continues to push the boundaries of what is possible with art. He is constantly experimenting with new techniques and materials, and he is always looking for ways to challenge himself and his audience.

Today, Don is widely regarded as one of the most exciting and talented artists in western Washington. His work has been featured in galleries both locally and along the west coast, and he has received numerous awards and accolades for his contributions to the art world. He currently teaches art at two different colleges. With his boundless creativity and infectious enthusiasm, he is sure to remain a major force in the world of art for many years to come.

This body of work directly relates to my interest in studying the psychology of today's portrait and our need to fit in or be "liked". My interest in math and organizing content has led me to create my compositions using sacred geometry as a means to create my fragmentations and abstractions. This new organization of cubism allows for multiple views from different angles, minus the randomness of it all and instead, through the use of sacred geometry, creates a visual purpose that is actually part of the physical fabric of our universe.
