Jake Prendez is a renowned Chicano artist, public speaker, and owner/co-director of the Nepantla Cultural Arts Gallery.

He was selected in summer 2016 to participate in the National Association of Latino Arts and Cultures Leadership Institute, won the "People's Choice" award at the 2017 Fiestas Patrias Art Exhibition, selected to serve on the Northwest Folklife Cultural Focus Committee in 2018, serves on the Arts Advisory Committee for 4Culture since 2019, won the Roberto Maestas Legacy Award in 2019, recipient of the ARC Fellowship Award, co-founded the Proxima Genercion Youth Artist Residency, has served on the board of La Sala since 2020, selected to serve on the Humanities Washington Speakers Bureau

in 2020 and served on the Seattle Art Museum Advisory Circle for the American Art

Collection reinstallation.

In 2019 Jake opened up the Nepantla Cultural Arts Gallery on the border of White Center and West Seattle with his fiancé Judy Avitia-Gonzalez. The gallery is a multi-use, multicultural art space grounded in the Chicana/o Latinx arts traditions offering monthly art exhibitions and free arts programming.

Jake creates art with a specific focus on themes relating to Chicana/o culture, activism, social justice, pop culture, and satire. His artistic style ranges from indigenous iconography, social realism, portraiture, to colorful pop art.

His Master's thesis was entitled The Art of Rebellion: Social Justice and Chicano Visual



Arts. He spent 15 years living and working in Los Angeles where he was a founding member of The Barrio Boogie Collective, The Art Jam/ Buen Pastor Mural Project as well as a founding member of the Chicana and Chicano Bar Association of Greater Los Angeles. Jake now resides in White Center, WA.
