# **Sue Roberts**

Guemes Island, Washington

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Born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, Sue Roberts received a BFA from the University of Kansas in 1983. She went on to study life modeling at the Art Students League in New York City, and bronze casting/metalwork in Central Florida.



As a child Sue Roberts loved making things with her hands and knew from a very young age that she wanted to be an artist. Influenced by MAD magazine and The New Yorker cartoons, she constantly drew cartoons throughout high school with the intention of becoming a cartoonist and animator. That all changed after taking a ceramics class her sophomore year of college, and from there she was hooked with learning about new materials/processes and making three-dimensional objects.

Having worked in a variety of materials, including encaustic wax, wood, copper and riveted sheet metal, Sue's main focus has always been sculpting and working in clay.

Roberts' work is known for its humor and stimulating social commentary, and has been written about in articles in the Orlando Sentinel, Metalsmith Magazine, Seattle Times, as well as featured in 500 Figures in Clay (Lark Books), 100 Northwest Artists (Schaffer Publishing) and Embracing Encaustic (Hive Publishing).

Her work has been displayed in museum shows and galleries across the United States and in Japan, and is in numerous private collections throughout the country. In 2002 Roberts received an artist residency at Penland School of Crafts in North Carolina, and in 2012 was an Washington State Artists Trust Grants for Artist Project (GAP) recipient.





Roberts' recent body of work deals with the concept of how to balance modern day relationships with the technology that has consumed us.

Roberts is intrigued by how distracted humans have become with cell phones and social media and how it affects our daily interactions and relationships with one another. What was supposed to be a world made simpler through technology has also created a society filled with anxiousness and a sense of isolation. Roberts' ceramic figures are an expression of these observations.
