

Meghan Elizabeth Trainor is a Seattle-based artist, writer, lecturer, performer, and curator. Her work has been exhibited nationally and internationally, from Seattle, New York, Copenhagen, and Barcelona. Her most recent solo exhibition was *Let Us Not Confuse Zero with The Stillness of Electrons* at the Center On Contemporary Art (COCA). She has been featured in Once Upon an Instant at HTW Berlin,

Goodwitch/Badwitch at the Museum of Museums; the Frye Art Museum's interview series, *Virtual Visits* hosted by Negarra A. Kudumu; and as a guest on Critical Bound Podcast's series *Art*, *AI*, and



Technology. She completed her master's at Tisch School of the Arts/New York University; and has been an artist-in-residence at the Lower Manhattan Cultural Council, the Digital Performance Institute, and the Janie & James Washington Foundation.

Trainor's practice centers her scholarship on the throughlines between computer science, technology, and esoterica. She frames this through storytelling around bogs, hedge witchery, digital witchcraft, and the use and histories of electronics and electricity. The range of her storytelling includes everything from essays on speculative histories to impressive installations to spoken word pieces and cunningly worded memes and graphic imagery. Her material practice includes creating low-voltage batteries from organic materials, the Venn diagrams that express logic gates but also echo phases of the moon and mandorla, and the creation of masks that point at a mythic conception of computer hardware.

She frequently guest lectures, most recently for the courses Considering Religious Robots at ITP/NYU and Utopia at The Danish Academy for Creative Writing. Her work has been cited by publications ranging from The Politics of Possibility to a solo exhibition *Bog Memory, Computer Memory,* Risk, and Security Beyond Probability, by Louise Amoore, The Women Who Disappeared from Computer History by Lone Kofoed Hansen, and The Feminist Data Manifest-No Playlist Compiled by T.L. Cowan with Marika Cifor and Jessica Lapp.

Trainor is the Curator of the M. Rosetta Hunter Art Gallery at Seattle Central College. The ArtsWA Board of Commissioners has appointed her to the 2022 ArtsWA Curator Roster for a four-year term.

Her next show is a collaboration with author and writer Sarah Lippek/Lypstk entitled Sphagnan: Ink & Logic, a meditation on gravity, electromagnetism, bog ecosystems and sigil-making that explores logic symbols, Green River mythos, predation, living outside, space-time travel, ink making, digital witchcraft, bog rituals, adventure, and transformation; Gravity's Rainbow for Girls.

Most recently, she has been invited to be an artist-in-residence at Captive Portal in Copenhagen, Denmark. The residency will culminate in a solo exhibition *Bog Memory, Computer Memory.*

Robot Philter

The result is an evocative sound piece called Robot Philter, which interweaves references to works in the exhibition and allusions to Trainor's own work with reflections on the "haunted screen" and the digital expansion of "the membrane of personhood."
