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Naomi Spinak is a fiber artist who lives on Bainbridge Island. Her gun violence memorial work includes works created with other artists in the Domestic (Terrorism) Arts collective. She has chaired the Bainbridge Island Trashion Show for 6 of its seven years. Her artwork includes textile arts, from costume design for theatre to avid knitting. Notable projects include an entirely upcycled costume design for *Peter and the Starcatcher*, a life-size sea turtle puppet for the Texas State Aquarium, and microfossil knitted animal patterns. She has won awards for her quilt, *Sweet Land of Liberty*, and her repurposed fashion in the Trashion Show. Her works have been displayed at the Bainbridge BARN, in Surface Design Magazine, the Kirkland Center for the Arts, Harvard University, and the Texas State Capitol building in Austin. Naomi holds an MFA in Costume Design and a BA in Art History and Technical Theatre.




